Importance

- * A colony has a right to establish a system of self-government and majority rule

- * Over 1000 people migrated to the New World
- * Seeking religious freedom

Motivation

- * To "purify" the Church of England
- * Church served as the government
 - "to live by the Word of God"

Conflicts

- * Wanted religious tolerance
- * Separation from church and state / govt
- * Wanted colonies to work together to establish rules and elect men as representatives.



Document Analysis: The Mayflower Compact

The Mayflower Compact

In the name of God, Amen. We . . . the Loyal Subjects of our dread Sovereign Lord King James . . .

Having undertaken for the glory of God, and advancement of the Christian Faith, and honor of our King and Country, a Voyage to plant the first Colony in the Northern parts of Virginia;

do by these presents, solemnly and mutually, in the presence of God, and one another, covenant, and combine ourselves together into a civil body politic,

for our better ordering and preservation and furtherance of the ends aforesaid . . .

do enact . . . such just and equal Laws, Ordinances, acts, constitutions, and offices from time to time, as shall be thought most meet and convenient for the general good of the Colony; unto which we promise all due submission and obedience

In witness whereof we have hereunto subscribed our names at Cape-Cod the 11th of November, in the year of the reign of our sovereign Lord King James, of England, France, and Ireland, the eighteenth, and of Scotland the fifty-fourth, Anno Domini 1620.


