Patriot	Wanted Independence
Neutralists	Did not support either side
Redcoats (Lobsterbacks)	British soldiers that wore red uniforms
Crispus Attucks	Freeman soldier that got shot at Boston Massacre
John Adams	Boston lawyer that defended the Redcoats - believed in the rule of law

 * 1st Battle of Am. Revolution

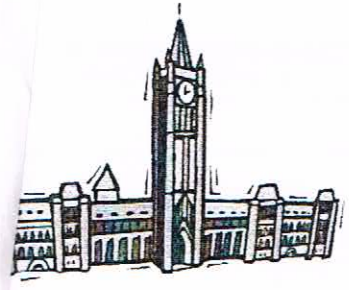

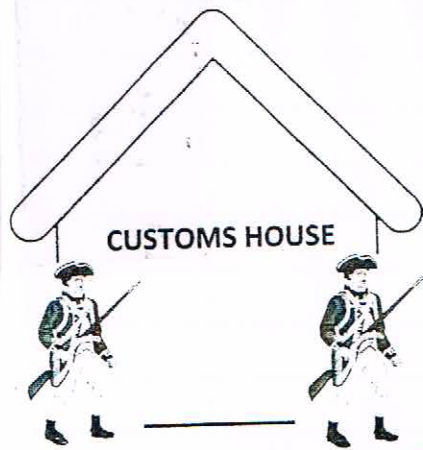

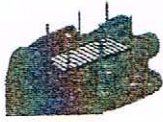
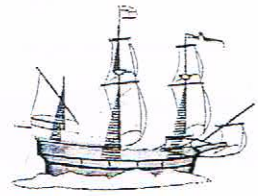
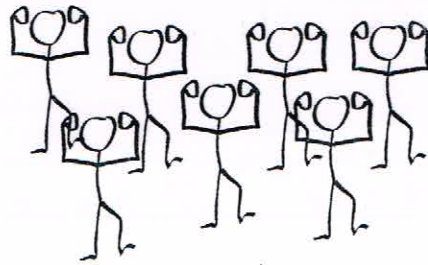

Boston Massacre



* A group of dockworkers began to shout insults in front of the Customs House.

* A fight broke out and soldiers began to fire
* 5 colonists were killed including Crispus Attucks

* John Adams defended the Redcoats
* Argued the soldiers fired in self-defense and followed the rule of law.

* The incident became a tool for anti-British propaganda in newspapers, articles, pamphlets, and posters.
