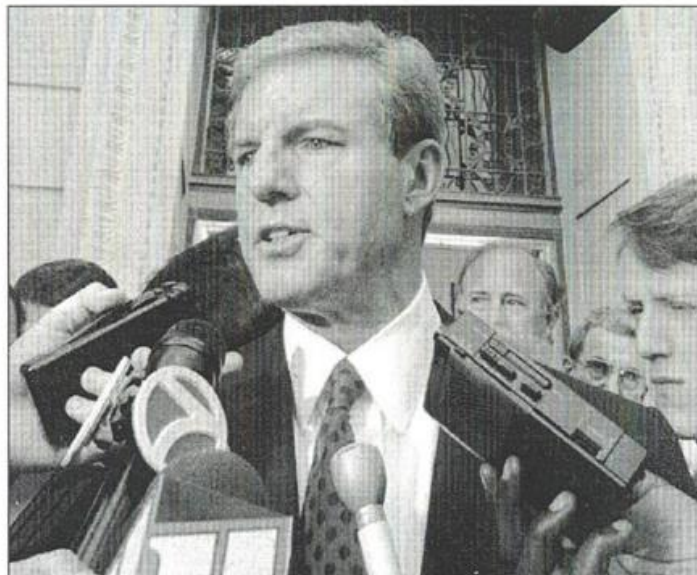

Now that he's become the Republican presidential nominee, Dole can turn to federal funds for support. After "running on fumes," as Dole aides put it, during the final months of the primary season, the campaign rushed to collect \$62 million in federal money to run the general election campaign. A messenger was dispatched from the from the Republican convention in San Diego to fly to Washington and deliver the necessary paperwork.

"There's nothing that compares to him at the national level. No one has been at it as long, raised as much money from as many special interest groups," said Fred Wertheimer, who fought Dole on campaign finance for years as president of the public interest lobby group Common Cause.




