Townshend Acts Repealed

All acts repealed excepted for tea to show that colonists should be taxed.

Tea Act

British Tea Company was the only company to buy and tax

Protest - refused to buy products



Boston Tea Party

A protest against British tea taxes in which Sons of Liberty dressed like Indians and threw tea into the harbor.

Are these actions a sign of protest or civil disobedience?

Civil disobedience - refused the law



Aftermath of the Boston Tea Party

Britain rejected the offer to repeal the Tea Act

Terms of Punishment:

- Pay back tea
- Sons of Liberty put to trial
- Intolerable Acts Passed



Intolerable Acts

Parliament appointed... General Gage as Mass. gov

- Closed Boston port
- Banned Committees of Correspondence
- Colonists would be put to trial




